- a. **Results demonstrated price-related promotions were significantly correlated with higher binge drinking and self-reported drinking and driving rates among students** (Wechsler, Lee, Nelson, & Lee, 2003).
- b. **The Surgeon General's Call to Action concluded "increasing the cost of drinking can positively affect adolescent decisions about alcohol use,"** and recommended "[e]limination of low price, high-volume drink specials, especially in proximity to college campuses, military bases, & locations with a high concentration of youth" (HHS, 2007).
- c. **A state law concerning low-price, high-volume drink specials may prohibit or restrict the following practices:**
- 1) **Providing customers with free beverages**
- **HFA2** (Adam Koenig) - Retain original provisions; amend KRS 243.0305 to allow distillery to report and pay wholesale taxes directly; effective date January 1, 2022
